PRAYER OF CONFESSION

Leader: Our lives are full of mistakes and errors — places where we follow self-generated idols instead of the One True God. We are not alone in these mistakes—all of those who have come before us also experienced temptation and sin. Let us come before God, just as generations of believers have done, and pray for God's forgiveness and grace.

All: Beloved God, who was known to our mothers and fathers, and even to our spiritual forebears, have mercy on us. We do not always love as you would have us love.
